Our work is driven by **political values** and **societal matters** which is reflected in our interest for devising characters and our singular curiosity for people's relational behaviours.



ABOUT THE PIECE



Rambling is gonna be the death of me is a piece of dance theatre molded on a retrospective on the act of growing up.

As emerging artists we are bringing to you our latest production devised around the story of two individuals merging identities. In a creative response to the interactions and influences others have on our behavioural attitudes; MicroMacro explores with passion and humour choreographic tools to share with its audience their aesthetic and begin a dialogue on the ongoing experience of growing.



Audience Engagement

The work MicroMacro produces is devised to be inclusive and open to all types of audiences. *Rambling is gonna be the death of me* is an insightful piece of dance theatre leaves its audience inquisitive on their own relational behaviours. The piece promotes adaptability and tolerance towards others' functional patterns. The piece questions the construction of identity and the social withdrawal that can come with it. It is essential for us to initiate conversations about the challenges of co-existing with others, but also propose a creative solutions.

Space

The collective aims to produce a work that is adaptable to different indoor and outdoor settings in order to make it easily toured and accessed by the widest public.

Involving

We desire to engage any audiences, regardless of level of exposure to contemporary dance and theatre. To do so, several routes of actions are considered:

- 1. We offer to work in close collaboration with different theatres, schools, cultural space etc in the devising of events based around our collaborative work practice, using the piece as a base for the creation of accompanying projects.
- 2. Delivery of workshops, post- and pre-show talks are possible to book in order to give a extensive experience to audiences.

WORKSHOP FOR DANCERS

Based around the piece.

• 1 hour Technique class

A company member will lead a class which will guide its participants in and out of the floor into more dynamic shifts into space. Creating relational awareness and group cohesion with games devised to enhance presence to the space and connectivity amongst participants.

• 2 hour Creative session

Following the class, the creative part of the workshop will explore the different aspects of the piece going from character composition to material division. The participants will be expected to leave with a deeper understanding of the piece and greater perspective of choreographic composition as a whole.

COMMUNITY WORKSHOPS

Based around MicroMacro's collaborative approach.

- MicroMacro is happy to offer intergenerational activities portrayed in different formats addressing the benefits of collective work.
- Through the use of games, group tasks and open discussions, the sessions would introduce tools for collaboration as well as notions of Group Dynamics. This will lead the participants towards a greater understanding of collectivity as a whole.
- Outcomes: Group work tools, personal awareness, confident presence, openness, listening skills, adaptability.
- Formats: 1 day (6 hours) / 2 days (12 hours)
